# MRCPCCH AKP

Opinion, advice and insight from the January 2019 Exam

The MRCPCCH AKP examination (2019/1) took place on 9 January 2019 with the results released on 15 February 2019.

Of the Pastest users who provided their score, nearly 59% passed the exam. The majority agreed that the second paper was particularly difficult - due to a number of 'obscure' questions - and the hardest topics faced were **Statistics, Endocrinology and Growth** and **Metabolism and Metabolic Medicine**.

## Expect lots of images

A high volume of images appeared in this exam. They were also varied in nature, with graphs, spot diagnoses, tables, ECG interpretations, X-rays and MRI images all appearing.

A number of subscribers also expressed disappointment with the quality of the images in the exam, one saying that: **"The quality of pictures, in particular the ECGs, were not that good. There were no tools to enlarge the pictures to focus on the details."**
